SPOTLIGHT ON...Café Feature Item of the Month - CLEMENTINES

As part of a School Improvement Team (SIT) initiative, we are working with Food Services to improve the excitement about what is being served in the LH Café! This month, we are introducing the concept of a 'feature item'. January is CLEMENTINE MONTH – that means students will be enjoying these delicious fruits as part of their school lunches!

- What is it?
 - A clementine is a hybrid cross between a Chinese Mandarin and a Sweet Orange.
- What's so great about them?
 - They are juicy and less acidic than an orange. They are easy to peel and are mostly seedless. Delicious!
- Why should I eat it?
 - Each clementine has 36 milligrams of Vitamin C, that's almost all of the Vitamin C you need in one day. Vitamin C is needed to grow and repair your body.
- Fun Fact
 - When bees cross-pollinate clementines with other fruits, clementines can lose their seedless quality. In 2006, clementine growers in California threatened to sue beekeepers to keep the bees away from their crops to prevent the dreaded seeds!
