A MESSAGE FROM THE PRINCIPAL

As August rolls around and we begin to think about going "Back-to-School", one rarely envisions a two- week heat waves! Mother Nature brought us sunny, hot and humid days which made for an unusual beginning. The weather wasn't the only surprise for our 400 students. They came to school to find the Main Office in a new location! When you come through the front doors of Lloyd Harbor, the beautiful new office spans the distance of the entire front hall. Large windows provide enhanced visibility and create a safer, more welcoming atmosphere. In addition, the Health Office has been relocated to the opposite side of the entry doors (where the Main Office used to be). The space for our Nurse and her student visitors is more conducive to privacy and treatment. There are other upgrades throughout our school that excite us. In our gymnasium, the PTG has generously donated funds which allowed us to purchase new fiberglass backboards. Musical Theater banners hang along the side of the stage memorializing the musicals performed by both our fifth and sixth graders and will be added to each year. Even with these changes, the one thing that remains constant is the dedication of our faculty and staff! We are committed to making our learning environment one that is challenging, authentic, and motivating!

Communication continues to be an important aspect of each day. As I discussed at this week's Welcome Back PTG meeting, **email is not** an effective way of contacting us when situations arise that need immediate attention. A phone call to the main office will allow for a prompt response, which as you know, is very important to us.

We also need to remind you that changes in dismissal must be decided on the night before and sent directly to the classroom teacher through a note with your child (not an e-mail). If an emergency arises and you have to make a change in your plans during the day, please call the main office. At that point, we will ask you to follow-up in writing. This, however, should be the exception, not the rule. Since last spring, we've been averaging 40-50 dally "emergency" changes that come through the main office and it is impossible for us to manage them all. Additionally, when scheduling play dates, please know that students may not bring more than two friends home on a bus (due to safety and space).

Welcome to what we know will be one of the most exciting years at Lloyd Harbor School! As always, we appreciate your support and all you do for our entire school community. - *Mrs. Massimo*

If you need to pick up your child before regular dismissal, you must be here **before 2:45PM.** All pick-ups after that time will occur at the back circle, due to the arrival of the buses and traffic flow.

DISMISSAL PICK-UP

If you pick up your child at dismissal, you <u>must</u> go to the back circle. Please wait in line or, if you are here early enough and find an empty parking space, you may park and walk to the circle doors to meet your child.

SAFETY DRILLS

As you are aware, New York State regulations require schools to conduct various types of safety drills throughout the year. This includes fire drills, sheltering drills, staging drills and lock-downs. Classroom teachers review procedures with the students and have prepared them for the increased frequency of scheduled drills. During the remaining months of the school year, we will conduct drills as a matter of course and without notification. Thank you for your continued support of our school safety procedures.






