# Spotlight

Social and Emotional Literacy (SEL) is an important part of our culture here at Lloyd Harbor School. A part of what we do is based on the work of Mark Bracket (http://ei.yale.edu/ruler/). The approach is based on self-regulation and identifying your emotions using a mood meter. One of the ways we teach children about feelings is through a monthly SEL word. Related age-appropriate words are then assigned to each grade level and are used in classroom conversations and integrated into instruction. Weekly 'infomercials' are put together by our mental health staff and performed by students on the LHTV Morning News. They communicate a powerful SEL message in front of the green screen with the Mood Meter visible in the background. Children know this message as the segment that begins with... "Today we are going to talk about YOU!" As we enter November, you will notice, at the top of the page, that our first SEL Word of the Month is Accepted. The grade level words related to Accepted are: Grade 2 – Included, Grade 3 – Tolerant, Grade 4 – Encouraged, Grade 5 – Supported, and Grade 6 – Connected. Please feel free to include these words in your family conversations this month and ask your children to make connections through books they read, class discussions, and their own daily lives!
