Each year, Lloyd Harbor students learn about Veterans Day and the important role Veterans have in our lives. We celebrate these brave men and women in the Armed Forces who put their lives at risk to ensure we can enjoy the freedoms we experience in every-day life. This year, thanks to the efforts of the Student Council, we were able to collect over 20 packed boxes of candy, toiletries, and wool socks to send to our troops. One particular soldier, US Navy Officer Richard Mooney (a 27 year-old helicopter pilot and a relative of a Lloyd Harbor family), helped guide our efforts. Another significant highlight of our celebrations included our special outdoor ceremony held on November 9, 2015. First Lieutenant Douglas Wauchope attended Lloyd Harbor School back in the 1950's. He served in the military and is believed to be the only veteran killed in action to attend LHS. We recognized his efforts and bravery with a special Plaque Dedication event involving the entire sixth grade, faculty and staff, speeches by his relatives (who still reside next door), Student Council officers and advisors, and musical performances by the Harbortones and Fanfare Group. His brother Ret. Ambassador Keith Wauchope addressed the students and shared his memories. Thank you to all of our families who made these initiatives and celebrations possible.




## Friday, December 11, 2015 9am




