### **SWITCHING BUSES FOR PLAYDATES**

As a reminder, when setting up playdates, the maximum number of additional children riding the bus with your child is TWO. Our buses are full and we do not have the room to accommodate large numbers of playdates or parties. Thank you for your support.

### **LATE TO SCHOOL**

Just a reminder, students are marked late to school if they get to their classroom after 8:50AM. If you are dropping off your child after this time, you must drop off at the main entrance. The back door will be locked promptly at 8:50AM.

### **KINDERGARTEN REGISTRATION**

Parents and Students,

The cold and flu season is upon us and it is especially important to remind and show your children the importance of taking care of their bodies. We all must wash our hands thoroughly, and often with soap and water. If they have a runny nose, sneezing, and/or coughing, remind them to use tissues and to discard them. Cover their mouths by coughing or sneezing into their elbow. Keep their hands away from their mouths and faces, and not to share personal items such as drinks, utensils, or lip balm. If you have an open cut, washing it with soap and water and keeping it covered is the best protection.

**As a reminder, children should stay home from school if:**

- Fever in past 24 hours
- Vomiting in past 24 hours
- Chills
- Strep Throat-must have been taking antibiotic for at least 24 hours before returning to school.
- Bad cold with very runny nose or bad cough, especially if it has kept the child up at night
- Flu
- Conjunctivitis (pink eye)- must have been receiving prescription eye drops for at least 24 hours before returning to school

Our custodial staff has been spending extra time and effort to disinfect all areas.

As always, proper nutrition, adequate rest and frequent hand washing will help keep them healthy.

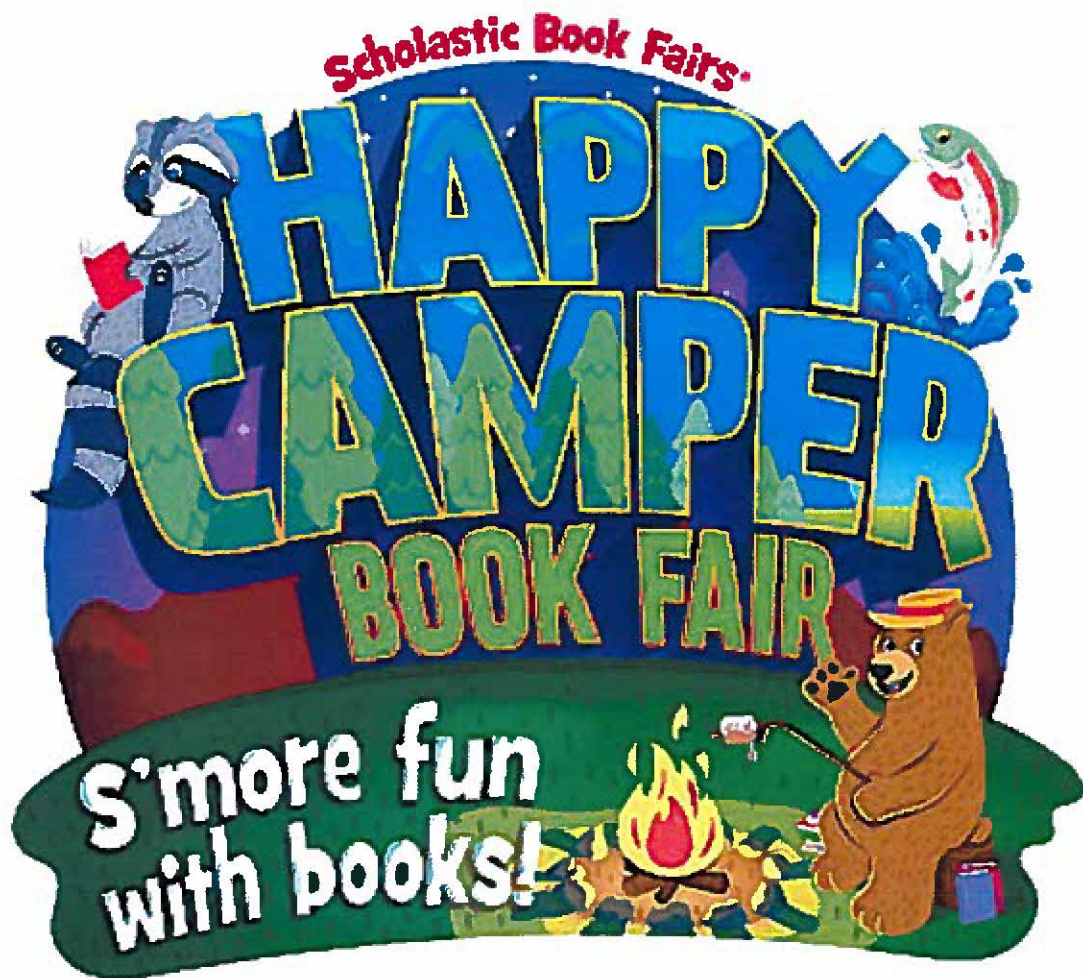
