FROM THE NURSE – MEDICATIONS IN SCHOOL

When it is necessary for a student to take any medication (over the counter or prescription) during school hours, the nurse must have written orders from a physician. In addition, the following are required: Parents must give written permission for the nurse to administer medication. Doctor's orders must include child's name, date of birth, diagnosis, medication, dose, frequency and duration. Medication must be in its original container and stored in the Health Office. Students are not permitted to self-carry medication.

KINDERGARTEN REGISTRATION

Information for Students Entering Kindergarten in September 2013

To be eligible for kindergarten in September 2013, your child must be 5 years of age on or before December 1, 2013. Your child is ***NOT AUTOMATICALLY*** enrolled as a kindergartner. Even if you currently have children attending Cold Spring Harbor Schools, ***you must still register your incoming kindergarten child.*** **Timeline:** As soon as possible, please contact the district registrar, Gloria Albert, to ensure that your child's name appears on the district census. Please call (631) 367-5910. In January, you will receive a letter from the Superintendent of Schools, Dr. J. Wilansky, explaining the procedure and listing the documents required for registration. Once you receive the letter, please call Gloria Albert to make an appointment to register your child. **You MUST have an appointment to register your child for kindergarten!** **Registration dates: February 4-8, 2013.** In March 2013, a welcome letter containing important information about Kindergarten Screening and Orientation will be mailed to you from Goosehill Primary School.

Dear Parents,

Over the past few weeks, it has come to our attention that many of our students have been using a relatively new form of social media called **INSTAGRAM**. This free app (from the iTunes store or from the Google Play website) provides the opportunity for people, even some of our younger students, to post pictures and messages using a Smartphone, iPod, iTouch, iPad, or other tablets and 'smart' devices. While, to our knowledge, this activity has not occurred during the school day, we feel compelled to reach out to you as it is important that our lines of communication continue to remain open. Recently a number of parents and concerned students have informed us that some of our students are not only using this app, but posting pictures and messages that are considered to be inappropriate, embarrassing, and even potentially dangerous to their safety and well-being.

While **Instagram** is what seems to be the trend today, we are aware that in the world of technology and social media, trends change at a rapid rate. Another popular and precarious app seems to be **Snapchat**, in which the user sends a picture that disappears without a trace within seconds. As noted in most registration policies (i.e. *Facebook* and *Instagram*), children under the age of 13 are restricted from use.

With access to devices such as iPads and Smartphones comes a great deal of responsibility. Naturally, we are taking steps to ensure that our students are aware of these responsibilities when using different forms of technology. **We hope that you are joining us in having discussions with them to highlight the importance of making conscientious decisions at all times.** It is crucial that we work together to support our learners and keep an open dialogue.

We would also like to take this opportunity to remind parents and students of our technology "acceptable use" procedures that are in effect during school hours. The following has been published in all elementary student agenda books:

- **Cell phones, iPods/iTouches, video games and other electronic devices must be kept in students' backpacks during the school day and may not be used. They are to be visible only if a teacher will be supervising their use for instructional purposes.**
- **Internet access is only permitted when supervised by an adult. As always, students must adhere to our Proper and Acceptable Student Technology Use document.**
- **If a student needs to call home, he/she should ask permission to use the phone in the main office. Students are not allowed to use cell phones during the school day.**
- **No unauthorized taking of photos or video/audio recordings are permitted at any time during the school year.**

We would also recommend that families review the *Proper and Acceptable Student Technology Use* document, which can be found on our District website and in the elementary student agenda books.

Thank you for taking the time to help us as we work together to continue to educate our students and encourage their growth. It is our hope that you will use this letter as a springboard to begin or continue a meaningful technology conversation with your children. 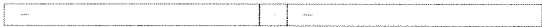

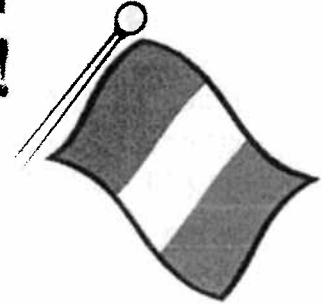
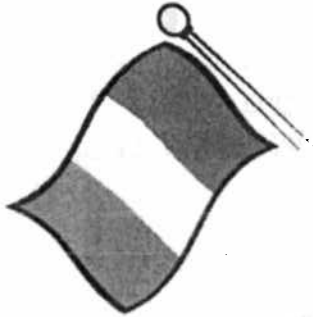

The Children's Program Level 1-2 Italian 6 to 11 years old:

The children Program are designed for children age 6 to 11 years old. Classes are conducted in Italian by a native teacher who engages children in songs, games, craft activities by using the 4 skills: listening, writing, reading and speaking. In our centers, teachers engage the children speaking most of the time solely in Italian.
