President's Report...

BOE President Ingrid Wright's report included the following:

Welcome back! Welcome to the 2018-2019 school year. On September 4th, we opened our schools to 1,722 students. From our youngest kindergarten students experiencing their first "first day" at Cold Spring Harbor to our oldest students entering senior year experiencing their last "first day" at Cold Spring Harbor, the beginning of school stirs great excitement for ALL of our students. Tonight we will hear opening reports from all of our buildings and our athletic department. In addition, we will be able see the excitement of our students on their first day in a presentation of photos that our publicist, Karen Spehler, has put together for us.

On August 29 and 30th, our faculty participated in workshops, professional development and presentations during our Superintendent's Conference Days. Our staff participated in workshops focused on math at the elementary school level, in addition to, our Science 21 program at the 2nd grade level. Furthermore, we offered professional development in the areas of Middle Level learning and teaming, and sessions focusing on Social Studies for our 5-12th grade level teachers. In addition, technology sessions were offered to educate staff members on new programs which they can utilize in class with their students. I would like to thank Kurt Simon for his work in organizing these two days for our staff. Kurt's leadership is critical to ensure that our faculty has the tools needed to continue to learn new ideas in the educational landscape and further work to improve their craft.
