They enjoyed their field trip to the CSH Fish Hatchery, where they learned about the habitat of many local species of fish and turtles and the adaptations that support their survival. We are fortunate to have such a wonderful partnership with the Fish Hatchery. Our children learn so much from their experiences there and from raising their classroom turtles.

Our students are enjoying hearing their HERO acts read during morning announcements. They are proud to be recognized for times they are honest (even when it isn't easy), when they show empathy for another person, and when they treat their environment and the people around them with care and respect. They are also proud to be working at home to earn coins to contribute to our *Coins for Cats & Dogs* drive in support of Little Shelter.
