In the coming weeks, each kindergarten class will make visit to a first grade classroom. The students will spend time reading or doing a fun activity together. The teachers and I believe this experience helps build excitement while helping our students feel comfortable about their move over to the first grade hallway!

Our first graders will visit West Side and Lloyd Harbor Schools on June 12th to help them envision what second grade will be like next year. They will ride a "big bus" to their new schools where they will have a tour and spend time in the second grade classrooms.

While we think about the future, we are still very busy and focused on the present! The children are learning new things every day and using the skills they have developed this year in exciting ways.
