Thank you to all who attended Wednesday's GPFA meeting. I hope you will attend as many meetings as you can this year! At each meeting, the teachers and I will be presenting on topics that will help you support your child's academic and social-emotional development. Next month, Officer Fiorillo will be joining us for a discussion on school safety.

At Wednesday's meeting, our school psychologist, **Mrs. Schmid**, special education and AIS teachers, Mrs. Wolf and Ms. Shalley, reading teacher, **Ms. Bayer**, and Speech-Language teacher, **Ms. McDevitt**, shared a little bit about their programs. We emphasized the fact that we work as a team to ensure that every child gets the support they need before they encounter frustration or lose interest in learning. Most children need a boost in some area at some point in the school year, whether it be in the area of reading readiness, social skills, or math concepts. We assess children often and offer support as it is needed. You will be informed if your child will receive support on a regular basis beyond what his/her teacher provides in the classroom.

Here are a few tips that will help your child thrive as a young learner this year:

- 1. **Read to your child every day**. Reading aloud to children helps children more than any other activity that parents can do.
- 2. **Let your child be bored!** Children need "downtime" and time to figure out how to amuse themselves. It will support creativity and their ability to delay gratification, an important life skill.
- 3. Children need a lot of time and patience to develop skills. Let your child try to do things independently. Talk your child through a task or model how to do it rather than swooping in and dOing it for him/her.
