Dear Students and Families,

As 2022 winds down and we look forward to all that 2023 may bring, we are reminded of how much happens in a school year. The planning and preparation that go into a successful school year starts early. In fact, the planning and creation of the building's next master schedule begins early in the current school year. This issue of our newsletter is jam packed with all the information our students and families need to be able to plan ahead, explore options, reflect on personal and academic goals, and make thoughtful and informed decisions.

During the month of December, teachers in the Jr/Sr. High School will make course recommendations for their current students' 2023-2024 academic program. COURSE SELECTION TIMELINE

I. December 2022:

- \Rightarrow Teachers make course recommendations for individual students in all core courses. Course recommendations will be visible on the eSchool student/parent portal on December 19.
- \Rightarrow Program of Study and individual grade-specific scheduling sheets are available for students/ families to review and use to plan a list of requested courses.

II. January/February 2023:

⇒ School counselors meet with students to review course recommendations and choose elective courses. Parents are encouraged to participate.

III. March 6, 2023:

 \Rightarrow Course requests will be locked and master schedule build will begin. Changes to course requests will not be made after this date; level changes will be reviewed as needed.

Classroom Counseling Sessions

During the month of December, counselors will be meeting with students in classroom sessions to address the College Process Kick-Off with students in grade 11. Also, students in grade 8 will participate in classroom sessions on high school planning to follow-up on the evening Parent/Student Night program for 8th grade families. The counseling department works with students in classroom and group settings to provide information to all students before following up individually to address specific students' interests and plans.

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2023 - 2024 COURSE SELECTION

A student's high school course schedule allows them to engage in academic options that are rigorous, interesting and rewarding. Thoughtful planning includes a balance of challenging coursework with opportunities to meet with success. As you choose from the many options, you are encouraged to think about your four-year high school plan and your academic goals. Some questions you may want to ask yourself include:

Which subjects interest me most?
What are my strengths?
What challenges me most?
What challenges me most?
How much time can I commit to my school coursework and my other activities?

Decisions that are made during the course selection process lead to the creation of the master schedule and course placement. It is important to make thoughtful decisions while factoring in the level of rigor of each course, the overall commitment of the entire course schedule, and the ability to balance school and other commitments. Student transcripts ultimately reflect courses taken and grades earned. Careful planning with the end in mind can lead to success.

Grade-Specific Scheduling Forms:

Students and parents are able to view all course options, by grade level, using our *NEW* Grade Level Scheduling Forms (see below). These forms provide a list of courses available to students in each grade level. Families are encouraged to review the forms carefully, with specific attention to the expectations of individual courses, the individual student's interests, and both short and long term goals. The Program of Study is a great resource to access in order to learn more about course pathways and specific course topics. The <u>current Program of Study</u> is available as a reference and the 2023-2024 Program of Study will be posted, and available in printed copy, before the end of December.

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
PSAT Scores and Next Steps

Students in grades 10 and 11 who took the PSAT/ NMSQT in October are now able to view their score reports. Students can log into their College Board account for their full report. Also, scores have been uploaded into Naviance and can be viewed there. This <u>brief video</u> can help guide students through the score report.

Next Steps: All Cold Spring Harbor HS students have access to the *free* **Methodize Test Prep** Program. Students can access this program through the menu in their Castle Learning accounts. Methodize provides SAT and ACT prep tools including diagnostic tests, full length exams, a vocabulary builder and a complete selfpaced preparation program for both exams - SAT and ACT - with informative videos and instruction on specific test question types with tips to address them.
