

Industries in decline:


- > Housing

Banking Crisis


- > Banks failed and closed

Roosevelt's Alphabet Agencies

National Recovery Administration (NRA)

- > price controls
- > set a minimum wage




Public Works Administration (PWA)

build roads, bridges, tunnels, dams



Tennessee Valley Authority (TVA)


built dams and provides electricity to Tennessee River Valley



Federal Deposit Insurance Corporation (FDIC)

protected peoples' money in the bank

Section 3: Life in the Great Depression

Women

• Competed with men for jobs

African-Americans

• Competed with white Americans for jobs



Mexican Immigrants

- Many were <u>deported</u>
- Lived as <u>migrant workers</u>



Native Americans

• Hired to *build schools, hospitals irrigation systems*

Dust Bowl

- Severe drought in the Mid-West led to loss of farmland
- Sand storms called "Black Blizzards"

Social Security

• Guarantees <u>retired people a pension(\$)</u>
