

## Writing the EQUATION for a TABLE of values

When you're done your equation will look like this  $y = mx + b$

Step 1: Write "**m**" and "**b**" next to the table.

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**Let's find "b":**

Step 2: Look for the "0" in the table.....the number paired with it is your "**b**".

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**Let's find "m":** (remember, you will write it as a fraction!)

Step 3: Look at the first two y-values....ask yourself.....

*"How do I get from the 1<sup>st</sup> value to the 2<sup>nd</sup> value?"*

Make that the TOP of your FRACTION.

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Step 4: Look at the first two x-values....ask yourself.....

*"How do I get from the 1<sup>st</sup> one to the 2<sup>nd</sup> one?"*

Make that the BOTTOM of your FRACTION.

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Step 5: REDUCE the FRACTION, if you can.

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Step 6: Write the EQUATION and plug in your "**b**" and "**m**"....

So it looks like this:  $y = \boxed{\phantom{m}} x + \boxed{\phantom{b}}$

$m$        $b$
