

Types of Adverbs

Adverbs modify verbs, adjectives, or another adverb.

Adverbs of manner describe how something happens.

Common adverbs of manner:

carefully
correctly
eagerly
easily
fast
loudly
patiently
quickly
quietly
well

Adverbs of place describe where something happens.

Common adverbs of place:

abroad
anywhere
downstairs
here
home
in
nowhere
out
outside
somewhere
there
underground
upstairs

Adverbs of purpose describe **why** something happens

Common adverbs of purpose:

so
so that
to
in order to
because
since
accidentally
intentionally
purposely

Adverbs of frequency describe **how often** something happens

Common adverbs of frequency:


always
every
never
often
rarely
seldom
sometimes
usually

Adverbs of time describe **when** something happens

Common adverbs of time:

<i>after</i>	<i>recently</i>	<i>now</i>
<i>already</i>	<i>soon</i>	<i>yesterday</i>
<i>during</i>	<i>then</i>	<i>tomorrow</i>
<i>finally</i>	<i>when</i>	
<i>just</i>	<i>while</i>	
<i>last</i>		
<i>later</i>		
<i>next</i>
